**August 10** Twentyfive members and two guests attended our annual Membership Social and enjoyed hearing about the upcoming year's programs and field trips, shopping the ways and means table, and oh! That magnificent feast!!!



## SEPTEMBER IN THE GARDEN

**PLAN:** To destroy old stalks and leaves that shelter insects. Buy an refrigerate tulip, hyacinth and narcissus bulbs for about two months, bing careful to avoid storing close to applies because they produce methane gas, which can cause the bulbs to abort their flowering process. Prepare beds for strawberries and for early spring lowers. Divide violets if you have not already done so.

**PRUNE:** Dead stems on all plants.

**PLANT:** Bells of Ireland, cornflower, pansy, calendula, candytuft, carnation, delphinium, hollyhock, larkspur, sweet williams, pinks, snapdragon, stock. Divide and replant iris.

**FERTILIZE AND MULCH:** Amaryllis. Give mums a feeding of liquid fertilizer now and keep well watered.

**SPRAY:** For aphids, webworms, black spot.

**WEATHER PROTECTION:** Keep well watered to combat hot, dry weather

**BLOOMING:** Cannas, daylilies, bedding begonias, hibiscus, roses, zinnia and many others.

**VEGETABLES:** (Give or take a few days.)

Beans, bush thru 9/15

Beans, pole thru 9/10

Beet, 9/1 – 10/20

Broccoli plants, 9/10-11/15

Brussels Sprouts plants, 9/10-11/5

Cabbage plants, 9/15-12/31

Cabbage, Chinese plants 9/1-10/15

Carrott, 9/15-11/30

Cauliflower plants, 9/20-10/31

Garlic, thru 10/20

Chard,Swiss, thru 11/15

Kohlrabi, 9/20-11/30

Lettuce, leaf, 9/15-11/30

Mustard, thru 11/15

Spinach, 9/5-10/25

Turnip, thru 11/20

Pea, Edible Pod, 9/15-9/30

Pea, English, 9/15-9/30

Pepper, plants, thru 9/15

Radish, 9/1-11/30

Tomato, plants thru 9/15

### FLOWER SHOW – “ONE WORLD” – October 13, 2018

The Flower Show is just a short time away. The show this year is an environmental theme and has our usual design and horticulture exhibits as well as educational exhibits, and sponsored group entries from a workshop we will have the week before the show. The Show is on SATURDAY, October 13, free and open to the public 1-

3PM. Volunteers are needed for staging, judges' hospitality, to help with placement of horticulture, and to docent at the show.

The location is 1401 Martin Luther King Drive, Bryan, TX, at the Hope Crossing building which is a renovated elementary school. The show is actually in the prior cafeteria space and we are doing this in conjunction with the Open House at Family Promise of BCS, which serves homeless children and families in BCS. Our workshop with them will be about recycling and we will make some projects for display in the show on October 7, from 1:45-3:15pm (this is a SUNDAY).
