### FEBRUARY IN THE GARDEN

**PLAN:** Start a garden diary with places for botanical names, dates for planting, fertilizing and blooming. Decide what to plant for constant color in the garden and to coordinate with your interior decoration.

**PRUNE**: Roses, grape vines, summer-blooming shrubs.

PLANT: Dahlia, Dutch Iris, cornflower, cosmos, daisy, larkspur, nasturtium, petunia, phlox, pinks, scabiosa, water lily seeds, cuttings of

hardwoods, chrysanthemums, ivy and climbing fig. Perennials may be divided and set in their new positions if not done in the fall.

**FERTILIZE AND MULCH:** Grdenias, blooming bulbs, nandina and other shrubs and trees.

**SPRAY & DUST:** Any plants showing scale should be sprayed with dormant oil if not done in January.

**WEATHER PROTECTION:** Keep plants in good condition by watering, but not enough to activate growth.

**BLOOMING:** Flowering Quince, pansies, pinks, snapdragon, sweet peas.

**VEGETABLES**: (Give or take a few days.)
Asparagus (crowns) 1/15-3/15; Beet 1/5-3/5;
Broccoli (plants) 1/20-3/5; Cabbage (plants)
1/1-3/5; Chinese Cabbage 2/1 – 3/10; Carrots
thru 3/5; Cauliflower\* 2/15 – 3/20; Chard, Swiss
2/1 – 4/20; Collard\* 2/10 – 3/31; Garlic 1/13/15; Kale (plants) 1/20-3/10; Kohlrabi 1/203/10; Leaf Lettuce 1/15-3/2; Mustard 1/20-4/14;
Spinach 1/20-2/20; Turnip 1/15-4/20; Onion
bulbs 1/5-2/5; English Peas 1/20-2/20; Edible
Pod Peas 1/25 - 3/5; Potato, Irish 2/5 – 3/5;
Radish 1/25-5/5.
