spaces. Deana has been involved with parkland support since the early 90s in many roles such as identifying potential land for Copperfield Neighborhood park, volunteering with Friends of Copperfield Nature Trails and sitting as the Chair of Copperfield Nature Trails. Deana has been instrumental in the progress at Copperfield Park updating entrances and adding benches along trails. The Copperfield Trail System, a wet land drainage area, goes through her neighborhood in northeast Austin. Native plants have been added and hiking trails developed and clean up done. This is an organized group of people working on the project for several years. The award is for Deana's work and leadership on the project.
