Roselle Hibiscus

At the Oct meeting, Susie O brought stalks of Roselle Hibiscus. All parts of this plant are edible -

leaves, flowers, fresh and dried pods. The pods will open and sepal flare out. Sepals (collectively called the calyx) are modified leaves that encase the developing flower. The sepals are used



to make tea. The leaves have a lemony taste and can be used in salad or greens. The pods can be used to make jam. To make tea, use 1/2 cup fresh mature sepals (about 10 dried open sepals) and 5 cups water. Heat and simmer 15 to 30 minutes. Sugar, 3/4 cup, can be added if too tart. Also can add lime, mint leaves, honey.

Roselle Hibiscus is helpful for Vitamin C, for cholesterol, blood pressure, cold and flu problems. The plant comes from West Africa but is used in many parts of the world. Belongs to the same family of plants as other Hibiscus and also Okra. Thanks to Judy Schafer for the article.

site for the Never Forget Garden and the A&M Garden Club's Blue Star Marker.




