Aquatic Greens Farm - Pilgrimage/Tour

First greenhouse was started in August 2013 with over 18,000 gallons of water and 1560 square feet of growing space. The second, similar system in May 2014. Helen Q visited the Aquaponic Farm with the GC when it opened.

Aquaponics is a soilfree, sustainable farm at 2861 FM 974, B (Tabor Rd). Owner Sharon Wells shared concerns about water pH and we enjoyed her feeding the fish, with the water carrying nutrients to the plants. This dynamic natural
